As a former IBMer, you may have noticed news reports that indicate there are currently 500K open technology jobs, but our traditional universities are only producing one-tenth that number of computer science graduates. At any given time, IBM has thousands of job openings across the US, but like others in our industry, we can't always find enough candidates with the right mix of technology skills to fill all of those positions.
