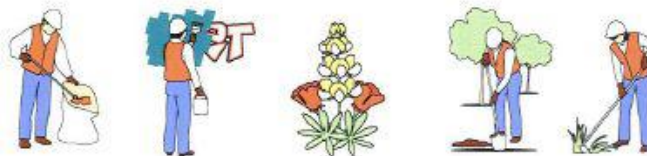

Alum Rock/Boccardo Trail Hike

Friday, May 13, 2005 9:30 AM

This month we'll be exploring the beautiful hills east of San Jose. We will begin the hike in Alum Rock Park, California's first and oldest municipal park. Nestled within the Alum Rock Canyon in the foothills of the Diablo Range, the park is filled with acres of natural, rugged beauty. We'll be taking the North Ridge and Todd Quick Trails, where after about a mile there is a junction with the Boccardo Corridor. This 1.5 mile trail, only open to the public since 2002, is designated as a portion of the Bay Area Ridge Trail. It will take us up about 1,100 feet to the top of a grassy knoll overlooking Silicon Valley. If it's a clear day, we'll have magnificent views.

The hike will be an out and back route, totaling about 5 miles. If you hadn't already guessed from the description, the "out" part of the hike is mostly uphill, but the route is so pretty that it's worth it. Do note that much of the time we'll be out in the open, so don't forget a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, and plenty of water. You never know how hot it might be! We will have lunch along the way in a nice shady eucalyptus grove.

We will meet at the Eagle Rock picnic area, which is the first parking lot you come to once you have entered the park. Note that there is a \$6 per car parking fee (this is not part of the county park system). To get to the park entrance, take highway 680 north and exit on Berryessa Road. Go east 1.2 miles. Turn right on Piedmont Road. Go .45 miles to Penitencia Creek Road. Continue 1.0 miles on Penitencia Creek Road to the entrance of the park. After you go through the entrance kiosk, look for the first parking lot on your right. People wanting to car pool, meet at the Camden Park & Ride (Camden & Hwy 85) at 9:00. Don't forget lunch and water.

Coyote Hills Walk

Friday, June 24, 2005, 10:00 AM

This hike was originally scheduled for February, but we were rained out. We decided to try it again at a time when it's less likely to rain! Coyote Hills Regional Park is part of the East Bay Regional Park district. The park borders the eastern edge of San Francisco Bay. The park's sprawling marsh teems with shorebirds; the grassy hills are home to rabbits and squirrels, and the skies are filled with hawks, gulls, geese, and many other birds. You'll want to bring your binoculars on this hike. We'll be walking about 4-1/2 miles taking a loop route through the park. The trails are flat and mostly paved. We will visit the marsh, Alameda Creek, and grasslands. The wide, flat trails are open with very little shade. (Be sure to bring a hat and sunscreen). We stop for lunch at a picnic area near the end of the hike. After the hike, you may want to visit the park's visitor center. Here, you may view exhibits, attend programs, or talk with the naturalist staff.

We will meet at the visitor center parking lot. To get to the park, we recommend taking Highway 101 north to the Dumbarton Bridge (highway 84) east exit. There is no toll going in this direction. Take the Paseo Padre exit. Turn north on Paseo Padre about 1 mile, then turn left onto Patterson Ranch Road. Drive about 1.5 miles more, past the entrance kiosk and Quarry Staging Area, to the end of the road where you will find the visitor center. Note that there is a \$4 per car entrance fee, payable at the entry kiosk in a machine. Since this is an East Bay park, your County parks pass won't be honored here. People wanting to car pool, meet at the Camden Park & Ride (Camden & Hwy 85) at 9:00. Don't forget lunch and water.
