Shasta Sunset Dinner Train Excursion

Thursday, May 31, to Saturday, June 2, 2007

We've had such a large interest in this trip, that we are now taking reservations for a second bus on the same schedule.

Don't hesitate; this one is also filling fast!

The trip will start with a stop in Williams for a no-host lunch at Granzella's restaurant and then we are off to a guided tour of the Shasta Dam where you will have time to visit the visitor's center before the tour. Dinner that night will be at Lily's—finest dining in Northern California. After a hosted breakfast the next day, a Step-on guide will join the group for local touring including Castle Crags and McArthur Burney Falls Memorial State Parks. Hikes

Los Alamitos Creek Trail Hike

Friday, February 23, 10:00 AM

How about a nice, flat, paved walk of about 4 miles? This month we'll meander down a trail that follows Alamitos Creek. Alamitos Creek flows from the eastern slopes of the Sierra Azul down in to Almaden Valley, where it meets Arroyo Calero, then the two continue north to drain into Almaden Lake. Although the creek may look mild and gentle most of the year, heavy winter storms created chronic flooding in Almaden Valley until the Santa Clara Water District widened the creek bed and installed levees in the 1970s. The trail is a joint effort between the City of San Jose and the Santa Clara Water District.

We'll be following the trail beginning at Almaden Lake and head south, following along the banks of the creek. Initially the trail skirts some housing developments, then it crosses the creek and runs parallel to Camden Avenue. The trail eventually abandons a roadside course and takes a final path along Calero and Santa Teresa Creeks, ending at Fortini Road near Santa Teresa County Park.

This will be a short walk and only 3.9 miles out and back. We'll picnic at the end of the walk. Of course, if you haven't had enough walking you can go back out for some more!

To get to the starting point, from Highway 85 and Almaden Expressway, travel south on Almaden Expressway, turn left onto Coleman, right on Winfield, and then turn right into the park. We'll meet in the parking lot. Note that dogs are allowed in this area (on leash of course) so you can bring your four-footed friends if you like. There are restrooms at the trailhead. Bring lunch and water. See you there!

Uvas Canyon Hike

Friday, March 30,
10:00 AM

Our March hike takes us to lovely Uvas Canyon Park in the southern part of Santa Clara County. The park has some great waterfalls, and if we have some spring rain, the falls will be spectacular. There are a couple of options for this hike.

The first is an easy, mainly flat loop route of about 1-1/2 miles along the Waterfall Loop Trail, which follows Swanson Creek. At a trail junction about 3/4 of a mile along, the Waterfall loop goes back to our starting point.

At the trail junction, those preferring a more difficult hike (translation – hilly!) can continue with the hike leader on the Contour and Alec Canyon trails. Manzanita Point along the Alec Canyon trail offers a spectacular view. Total distance is about 4.5 miles for the more difficult hike.

To get to the park from Highway 85 going south towards Gilroy, exit at Almaden Expressway. Stay in the ramp's middle lane, make the first left, then the next right onto Almaden Expressway. Drive about 4 miles to the end of Almaden Expressway, and turn right onto Harry. Almost immediately, turn left onto McKean. McKean turns into Uvas Road after about 6 miles. Continue on Uvas for about 3.5 miles, and turn right onto Croy. Drive a little over 4 miles to the park entrance at the end of the road. About 0.4 miles before the entrance you will pass through Sveadal, a Swedish vacation retreat. Note that the speed limit is only 5 miles per hour on this narrow road. You'll have time to look at the quaint little cottages where Swedish flags still fly and you are reminded to look out for the trolls!

We will meet at 10:00 AM at the day use parking area. After going through the entrance (\$4 fee unless you have a county parks sticker) drive up the road a bit and look for the "day use parking" sign on the right side. There are restrooms available near the lot. Bring lunch and water.
