# Letter to the Editor

#### Dear Editor:

The IBM Volunteer Outreach Council has awarded a \$1,500 grant to the Willows SeniorNet Learning Center, a 100% volunteer, nonprofit organization that provides low-cost, high-quality instruction in computer literacy and skills to mature adults. The Center is located at the Willow Glen Community Center in San Jose, CA, where it has a dedicated computer lab with 20 workstations, a projector, and other equipment. More than 15,000 students have taken classes at the Center and it currently enrolls nearly 220 students every 8 weeks in 15 different courses. The Learning Center has had a history of cooperation with the IBM Retirement Club since its founding in 1992. Twenty-five IBM retirees -- among them Bill Souza, Jeff Frier, Ruth Price, Scott Maiden, and Wayne Comb -- who volunteer at the Learning Center applied for this grant which will be used to purchase new projectors and printers. The Center's biggest challenge is offering courses on rapidly aging equipment. With new equipment it will be able to support a wider variety of courses, with fewer repairs required.
