### Proposed Club Constitution Change

**Article 6 - Section III.**

Terms of Office

A. Officers are elected in October, for a term of one year. Term is January 1 through December 31 of the following year.

B. All elected or appointed Officers may not serve in the same office more than two consecutive terms ~~or continuously serve as an officer for more than four consecutive years,~~ with the exception of the Membership and Communications Directors who can be elected every year without regard to the number of years served.
